2. Hutchinson's Bank, Chapel Bank & Threecorner Grove

A large area of secluded chalk grassland and woodland in Croydon. Supporting many rare plants and insects, which has benefited from the return of traditional grazing.

3. Roundshaw Downs

Roundshaw Downs is the largest area of unimproved chalk grassland in the borough. As such, it provides an extremely valuable nature conservation resource for insects, birds and wild flowers.
